The Mack bulldog logo came from soldiers in World War I who thought the 1916 AC Mack truck looked like the English Bulldog's flat nose and face.

Interstates that have an even number—like I-80—run east to west. Interstates that have an odd number—like I-95—run north to south.

A truck and trailer with a full load can weigh 80,000 pounds. That's about the same as eight elephants!

Interstate 90 is the largest interstate in America – it is nearly 3,100 miles long and runs from Seattle, WA to Boston, MA. Interstate 80 is the second longest interstate, running from Teaneck, NJ to San Francisco, CA for a total of 2,909 miles.

The average truck and trailer is 75 foot long. That would be about as long as 225 hotdogs placed end to end.

Truckers spend 240 nights or more away from their families each year. So be sure to thank a trucker for all that they do to deliver what we need!
